PROGRAM: Robbie Lee - Director of the Exceptional Foundation (introduced by Alex Lott)

The Exceptional Foundation is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit founded in 1993 for people with intellectual disabilities. E.F. has expanded with affiliate locations in Atlanta, Auburn & Daphne. It's mission and purpose are to promote healthy living, improve life skills, support social relationships, and foster community involvement. E.F. Birmingham is in a 32,000 sq. ft. facility in Homewood and serves hundreds of people ranging from 5 – 80 years old. No one is turned away for any reason. Although the cost is less than \$400/month, 20% of enrollees are on scholarship. On average, it serves 117 people daily and is open 10 hours per day. Last year, there were 356 total participants, a 30% increase over the previous year. Days are filled with field trips, sports activities, arts & crafts, cooking classes, and more with a focus on socialization. There are summer camps and after-school programs for school age kids. There's also continuing education and job training for older participants. There are some program limitations due to a small staff and no federal funding. Participant fees make up about 25% of the funding. The rest is raised through donations and fundraisers, such as the annual Chili Cook-Off at Brookwood Village that raised \$450,000 this year. It's always the 1st Saturday in March and continues to grow every year. Robbie also encouraged the group to support The Arc's "Gifts for All" to provide Christmas gifts to its participants, 75% of whom have no family.
